

## Children with Anxiety Disorders in Primary Care: the views of General Practitioners II

We invite you to take part in a National Institute of Health Research funded study which focuses on management of childhood anxiety disorders (children under 12 years) by General Practitioners in England. This study explores GPs' experiences of identification, management and referral of these disorders. Your responses will help inform practice guidelines for children with anxiety disorders.
